# The Four Stages of the Roadmap

## Resilience Roadmap Stages

### **STAGE 1: Safety and Preparedness**

Making essential workforce environment as safe as possible.

### **STAGE 2: Lower Risk Workplaces**

Creating opportunities for lower risk sectors to adapt and re-open.

Modified school programs and childcare re-open.

### **STAGE 3: Higher Risk Workplaces**

Creating opportunities for higher risk sectors to adapt and re-open.

### **STAGE 4: End of Stay-At-Home Order**

Return to expanded workforce in highest risk workplaces.

Requires Therapeutics.

# Stage 1: Safety and Preparedness

This is where we have been. Stage 1 Objectives:

- 1. Continue to build out testing, contact tracing, PPE, and hospital surge capacity.**
- 2. Continue to make essential workplaces as safe as possible.**
  - Physical and work flow adaption
  - Essential workforce safety net
  - Make PPE more widely available
  - Individual behavior changes
- 3. Prepare sector-by-sector safety guidelines for expanded workforce.**

# Stage 2: Lower Risk Workplaces

This is where we are now. Stage 2 Objectives:

## 1. Gradually opening some lower risk workplaces with Adaptations:

- Retail (e.g. curbside pickup)
- Manufacturing
- Offices (when telework not possible)
- Opening more public spaces

## 2. Expanded Workforce Safety Net:

- Wage replacement so workers can stay home when sick

# Stage 2 Sectors, Businesses, Establishments or Activities Considered Lower Risk and Include:

## Early Stage 2 Opening (Whole State)

- Retail Sector
- Logistics Sector
- Manufacturing Sector

## Expanded Stage 2 with Attestation (Variance)

- Destination retail, including shopping malls and swap meets.
- Personal services, limited to: car washes, pet grooming, tanning facilities, and landscape gardening.
- Office-based businesses (telework remains strongly encouraged)
- Dine-in restaurants (other amenities, like bars or gaming areas, are not permitted)
- Outdoor museums and open gallery spaces

## Not Allowed at this Time in Stage 2:

- **Personal services such as cosmetology, barbers, nail salons, tattoo parlors, gyms & fitness studios**
- **Hospitality services, such as bars & lounges**
- **Entertainment venues, such as movie theaters, gaming facilities, & pro sports**
- **Indoor museums, kids museums and gallery spaces, zoos, & libraries**
- **Community centers, including public pools, playgrounds, & picnic areas**
- **Religious services & cultural ceremonies**
- **Nightclubs**
- **Concert venues**
- **Festivals**
- **Theme parks**
- **Hotels/lodging for leisure & tourism**

# Review of Stage 3 & Stage 4

## Stage 3

- Higher-risk Workplaces
- Adapt and reopen movie theaters, religious services, & more personal & hospitality services

## Stage 4

- End of Stay Home Order
- Reopen areas of highest risk: e.g. Concerts, conventions, sports arenas.

# Variance to Stage 2

## Guidance to County Governments

- On April 28<sup>th</sup>, CDPH released the California's Pandemic Roadmap for counties to accelerate to Stage 2.
- Lake County can apply for Local Variance through demonstration in the ability to protect the public and essential workers.
- Lake County given its geographic location must be more cautious because of the close proximity to the Bay Area.

# Applying for Local Variance

- Notify CDPH of county's intent to seek a variance
- Certify through written attestation
- Attestations must be submitted by the local public health officer
- Letters of support from the County Board of Supervisors & local hospitals.

# Readiness Criteria Overview

To establish readiness a county must attest to the following criteria areas:

- **Epidemiologic Stability of COVID-19**
- **Protection of Stage 1 essential workers**
- **Testing capacity**
- **Containment capacity**
- **Hospital capacity**
- **Vulnerable populations**
- **Sectors and timelines**
- **Triggers for adjusting modifications**
- **Your plan for moving through Stage 2**

# Epidemiologic Stability of COVID-19

## CDPH Guidance

- **No more than 1 COVID-19 case per 10,000 in the past 14 days prior to attestation submission date.**
- **No COVID-19 death in the past 14 days prior to attestation submission date.**

## Current Lake County Status

- **Lake County meets this criteria**
- **Low infection rates (8 Cases Total)**
- **No deaths reported**

# Protection of Stage 1 Essential Workers

## CDPH Guidance

- **Provide copies of guidance to essential critical infrastructure workplaces to protect essential workers.**
- **Availability of supplies (disinfectant, essential protective gear) to protect essential workers. How will this availability be assessed.**

## Current Lake County Status

- **Lake County meets this criteria**
- **Public Health has developed guidance documents**
- **Access to documents on Public Health website**
- **Supplies are requested and distributed through the MHOAC**
- **Supply chains are actively monitored**

# Testing Capacity

## CDPH Guidance

- Minimum daily testing volume to test 1.5 per 1,000 residents (can be symptomatic and targeted surveillance) - for Lake County, approximately 100 tests/day.
- Testing availability for at least 75% of residents within 60 minutes drive in rural areas.
- Listing of all specimen collection sites in the county.

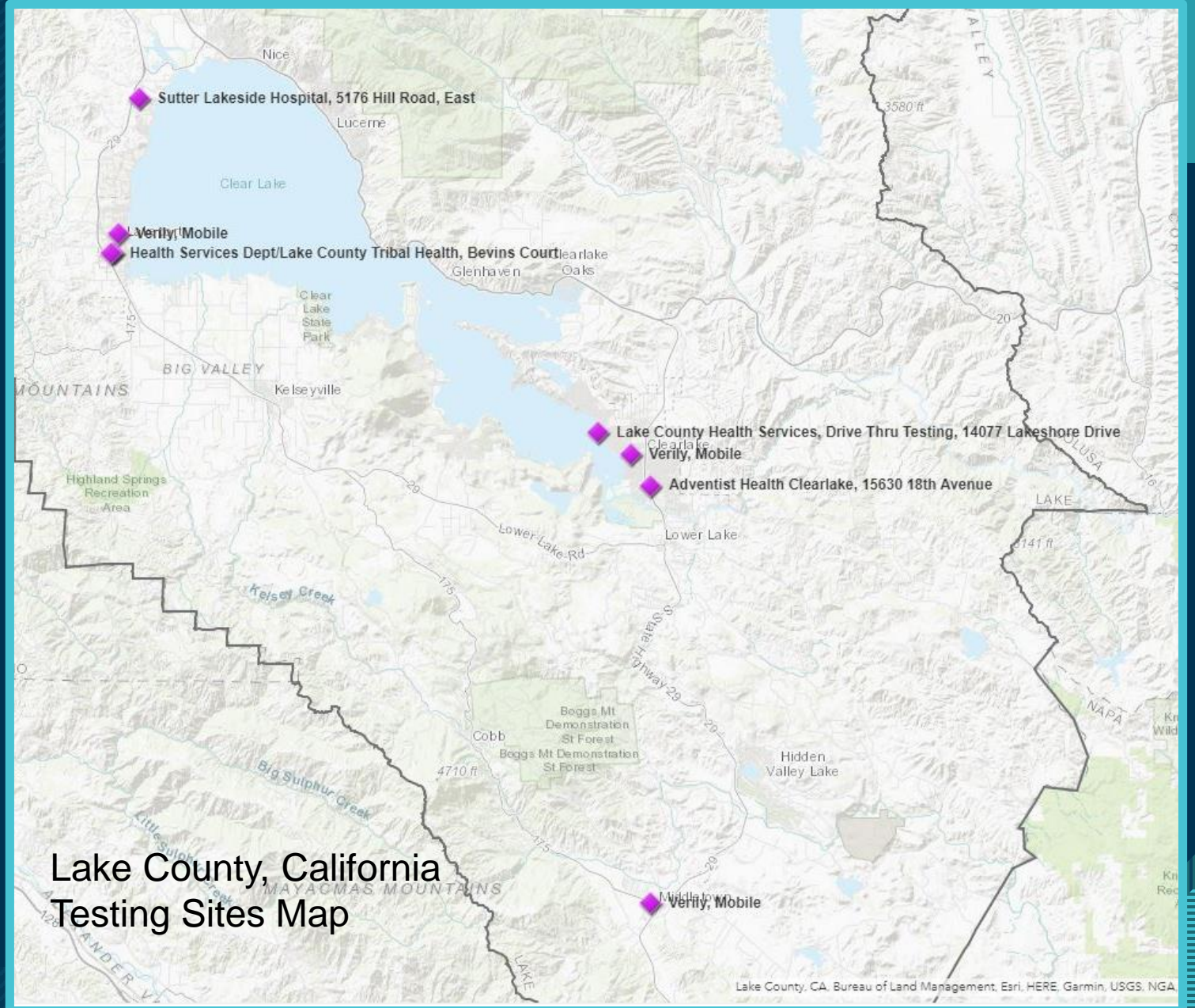
## Current Lake County Status

- County is working with Local Hospitals, clinics and Verily to meet the testing capacity
- Specimen collection site documentation has been recorded (See map on next slide)
- Public Health ramp up of Mobile Testing Capacity through:
  1. Drive-To Testing (completed 156)
  2. Drive-Thru Testing (completed 88)
- Lake County approved site for Verily Mobile Testing- Testing capacity of 100-125 per day

# Testing Sites Map

## Sites:

- Adventist Hospital
- Sutter Lakeside Hospital
- Health Services Mobile Sites
- Health Services Department
- Lake County Tribal Health
- Verily Mobile Testing Sites:  
Clearlake,  
Lakeport,  
Middletown (Tentative)





# Containment Capacity

## CDPH Guidance

- Counties with no cases, should have 15 trained contact tracing staff per 100,000 county population available; for counties with small populations, there must be at least one staff.
- Describe contact tracing plan
- Availability of temporary housing units to shelter at least 15% of county residents experiencing homelessness.
- Lake County housing requirement is 86 beds (County PIT Count is  $572 \times 15\% = 86$  People)

## Current Lake County Status

- Currently have 20 Trained Contact Tracing Support Staff available (5 On Staff, 15 volunteers- MRC & Trained MPH Students)
- Contact Tracing Plan under development
- Capable of Supporting 89 Beds:
  1. RoomKey Shelter -15 Beds
  2. Skylark Hotel – 16 Beds
  3. Juvenile Hall – 18 Beds
  4. Warming Center – 40 Beds

# Hospital Capacity

## CDPH Guidance

- **County hospital capacity to accommodate a minimum surge of 35% due to COVID-19 cases in addition to providing usual care for non-COVID-19 patients.**
- **County hospital facilities have a robust plan to protect the hospital workforce, both clinical and nonclinical, with PPE.**

## Current Lake County Status

- **Local Surge Planning is occurring, Public Health is actively working with both hospitals to meet this criteria**
- **Regional Surge Planning - Transport capacity is actively being monitored**

# Vulnerable Populations

## CDPH Guidance

- **Skilled nursing facilities (SNF) and Congregate Living have >14 day supply of PPE on hand for staff,**
- **Established process for ongoing procurement from non-state supply chains,**
- **List the names and contacts of all SNFs in the county along with a description of the system the county has to track PPE availability across SNFs.**

## Current Lake County Status

- **Documentation has begun**
- **Non-State Supply chains identified**
- **PPE is currently procured through MHOAC**
- **List of SNF names and contact information completed.**

# Sectors and Timelines

## CDPH Guidance

- Detail county's plan on which sectors and spaces will be opened, in what sequence, on what timeline.
- Indicate where the plan differs from the State's order.
- Provide details on Stage 2 sectors, businesses, establishments or activities that are considered lower risk.

## Current Lake County Status

- Recovery Work Group established
- Public Health and Recovery Work Group collaborating on development of plan
- Activities Defined:
  1. Retail, Logistics and Manufacturing Sectors
  2. Destination retail, including shopping malls and swap meets.
  3. Personal services, limited to: car washes, pet grooming, tanning facilities, and landscape gardening.
  4. Office-based businesses (telework remains strongly encouraged)
  5. Dine-in restaurants (other amenities, like bars or gaming areas, are not permitted)
  6. Outdoor museums and open gallery spaces

# Triggers for Adjusting Modifications

## CDPH Guidance

- **Define metrics that would modify the stage transition frequency and the specific actions triggered by metric changes.**
- **Determine how the county will inform the state of emerging concerns and how it will implement early containment measures.**

## Current Lake County Status

- **Metrics developed. Triggers identified and reviewed in following slides.**
- **CDPH notification system of emerging concerns established.**

# Triggers for Adjusting Modifications

General status	Metrics	High Priority	Lower Profile	Action	Action
Stable or improving	Overall favorable	COVID cases, hospital capacity, and PPE	Testing, containment	<b>Green Light</b>	Continue moving forward according to plan
Stable but with some concerning metrics	Minimal increase in cases, no clusters or well-contained. Some straining of testing & containment capacity.	Cases, capacity. Testing, PPE. SNF and jail status.	Homeless housing, surrounding counties	<b>Yellow Light</b>	Caution. Stop moving forward. Need to monitor closely. Consider additional data
Worsening metrics	Cases/deaths increasing. Clusters, surge capacity limited. Testing and containment getting overwhelmed. Jail or SNF outbreaks.	Cases, PPE, surge capacity. SNF, jail, homeless outbreaks.		<b>Red Light</b>	Stop. Consider adding some restrictions.
Very Bad--	Cases, deaths up, not able to contain. Outbreaks in congregate facilities that can't manage.	Cases, surge capacity, containment capacity.		<b>Put on the brakes / Go in reverse.</b>	Go back to full SIP orders.

## CDPH Guidance

- Provide details on your plan for county to move through opening sectors and spaces that are part of the State's plan for Stage 2.

## Current Lake County Status

- Recovery work group established
- Plan is being drafted

# COVID-19 Containment Plan

## CDPH Guidance

- 1. Not mandatory, Strongly recommended**
- 2. Plan Focal Areas:**
  - Testing,
  - Contact Tracing,
  - Protecting the Vulnerable,
  - Acute Care Surge,
  - Essential Workers,
  - Special Conditions,
  - Community Engagement,
  - Relationship to Surrounding Counties

## Current Lake County Status

- Plan currently under construction
- Collaborating with established work group to identify gaps and strategize
- Working on increasing testing capacity.
- Contact tracing criteria met.
- Actively monitoring neighboring counties and regional hospitals capacities
