## Lake County Assigned to the State Blueprint's Red Tier

*Hybrid Board of Supervisors Meetings with In-Person Participation to Resume 3/23*

**LAKE COUNTY, CA (March 16, 2021)** – Today, the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) updated their, “Latest California Blueprint Data,” confirming Lake County has been assigned to the Red Tier, and signaling enhanced available of activities can begin in tomorrow (3/17):

Lake County originally moved to the Purple Tier November 28, meaning activities such as indoor dining were prohibited for a period of 108 days. Based on the current version of the State's framework, we cannot become eligible to advance to the less restrictive Orange Tier until at least Tuesday, April 6. Counties can move only one tier at a time, and we must be in the Red Tier for three weeks prior to advancing to Orange. More information on the Blueprint for a Safer Economy is available here:
